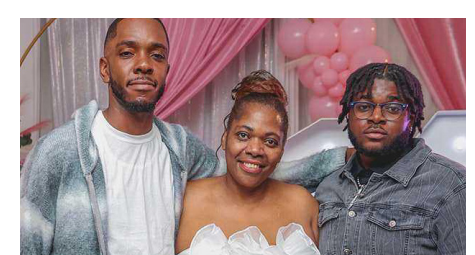
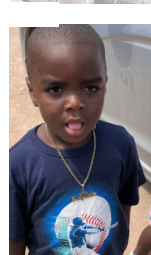
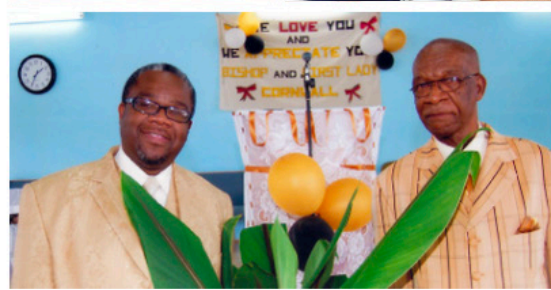
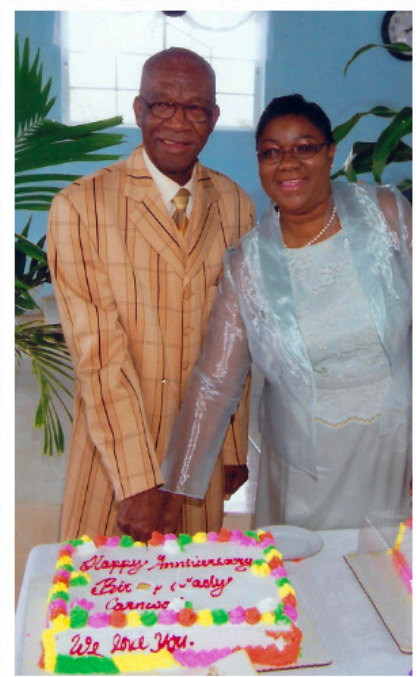
Mama was more than just a name, she was a force of love that shaped our world. We are better for having known her, and we are forever grateful for the years we spent in her light.

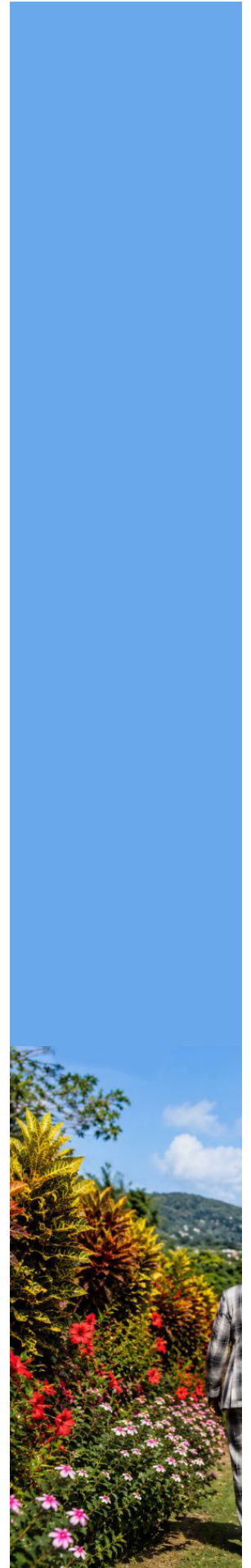

The Beneby Family extends sincere condolences to the family of Bishop Enoch Cornwall on his passing.

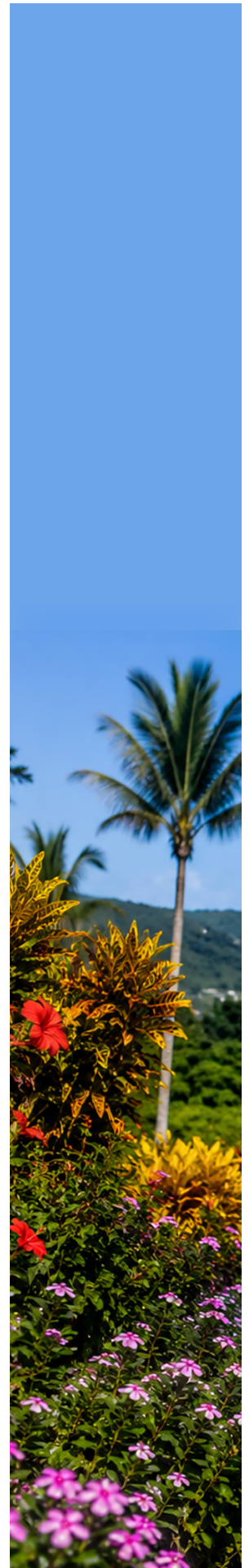

Thanks be to God for the privilege to have been blessed by the life of Bishop Enoch Cornwall, a man who allowed his life to be governed by his Christian convictions. He was not passive and ordinary, but was the kind of rare leader, family man, committed beyond measure, no nonsense, practical in his approach, bold in his proclamation of the Gospel, and did not seem to know how to be focused on self. He was not afraid to roll up his sleeves and do what needed to be done, in the home, at church, erecting tents and visiting in the community. Whether in the pulpit preaching with fire, or quietly attending to the practical needs of people he brought the same wholehearted devotion, faithful service.

Among the many gifts Bishop Cornwall carried was the ability to see a future in a person that the person could not yet see in themselves. Bishop Cornwall played a role in shaping the present and future of this church - in properties acquired, and in the lives of many of us who became ministers. He saw the hand of God at work and was not afraid to speak what the Spirit revealed. It was 1972 at my water baptism, he said "this young man will be a minister in the church," then I didn't even know or understand but I became a minister and years later he was the one who set me forth as a bishop in the church.

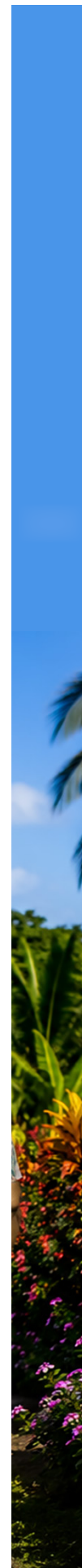
We travelled for church meetings in French Guiana, Grand Cayman. We travelled throughout Jamaica, attending meetings or seeing about the business of the church. We went for a meeting at a particular local church here in Jamaica when the people from the community on the outside decided to have things their way. They began throwing stones at the church building. It was comforting to be in his company as we prayed and sought God's direction in how to handle the matter. Near the time for National conventions, in the maze of all he had to do, he found time to drive to flat bridge and buy the East Indian mangoes that he knew we loved.

True friendship is tested not only in celebration but in adversity. Bishop Cornwall knew both and he never flinched from either. Each time my wife and I visited we had the opportunity to hear interesting stories of how God's power was manifested in his life. All who walked with him, sat with him and talked with him can recall the good times: the fellowship, the laughter, the shared victories of ministry and the challenges too.

Bishop Cornwall stood firm throughout his journey here on earth, he was willing to always abound in the work of the Lord. He showed that the Gospel is essential, people precious, and the call of God too important to be ignored or taken for granted.

Bishop Cornwall our example, our hero, leaves behind a legacy that cannot be measured in years alone, but in lives transformed, members and ministers raised, churches strengthened, and a faith modelled with integrity across decades of service in many places. He answered the call to share the gospel He gave himself fully to God in ministry, not seeking fame and recognition, but seeking only to be found faithful.

The voice of Bishop Cornwall is silent, but to many of us, his life still speaks while he rest in the presence of God.



In Loving Memory of Bishop Enoch Stanford Cornwall

Parish Overseer Emeritus

Born August 21, 1934 – Transitioned April 16, 2026

It is with profound respect and heavy hearts that we mourn and celebrate the life of Bishop Enoch Stanford Cornwall; a “Soldier of Soldiers,” a stalwart of righteousness, and a towering figure in the faith who has passed and gone home to be with the Lord.

Bishop Cornwall lived a life marked by unwavering devotion to God, steadfast service to the Church, and visionary leadership that shaped generations. A foundational pillar of the Church of God of Prophecy in Jamaica, he dedicated decades to strengthening the spiritual, administrative, and institutional life of the Church.

His pastoral ministry spanned several key congregations; Beacon Hill, 36 Maxfield Avenue, 25 Nugent Street, 41 Old Harbour Road, 42 Caledonia Rd. Mandeville, and Comfort; where he laid enduring foundations that continue to uphold the ministry today.

Renowned for his wisdom and unmistakable Kingdom impact, Bishop Cornwall was more than a preacher; he was a counselor, a shepherd, and a defender of the gospel. His commitment to education, governance, and strategic development helped shape the heritage of the Church and ensured that its mission would stand firm for generations to come.

Beyond the pulpit, Bishop Cornwall was deeply cherished as a family man, mentor, and spiritual father. His teachings on “Building Legacy” reflected his life’s mission to ensure that the values of God’s Kingdom were passed down both spiritually and generationally. His influence echoes through the halls of the COGOP organization and in the countless lives he touched across Manchester, St. Catherine, and the wider Jamaican church community.

His life was one of sacrifice without measure, a noble service that transformed the landscape of our faith. Though we mourn his earthly absence, we rejoice in the blessed assurance that he now rests in the presence of the Lord, having surely heard the words: “Well done, thou good and faithful servant.” The family and the Church of God of Prophecy wish to express their sincere appreciation and thanks to everyone for their thoughtfulness, prayers, and loving support during the passing of Bishop Enoch Stanford Cornwall, Overseer Emeritus.

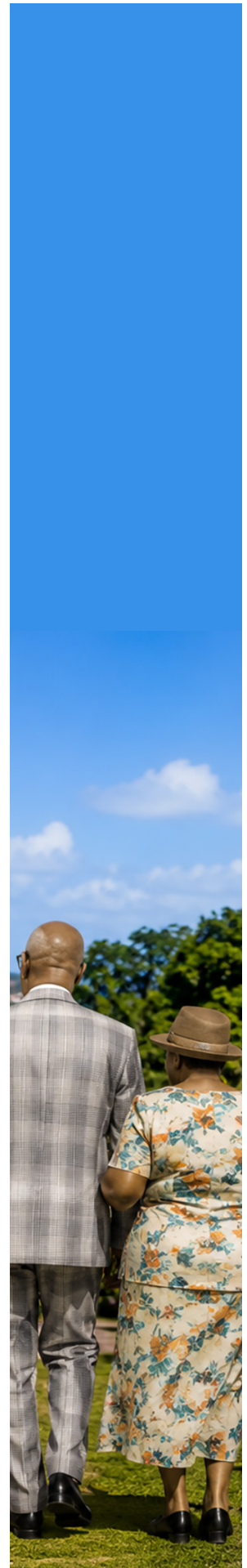

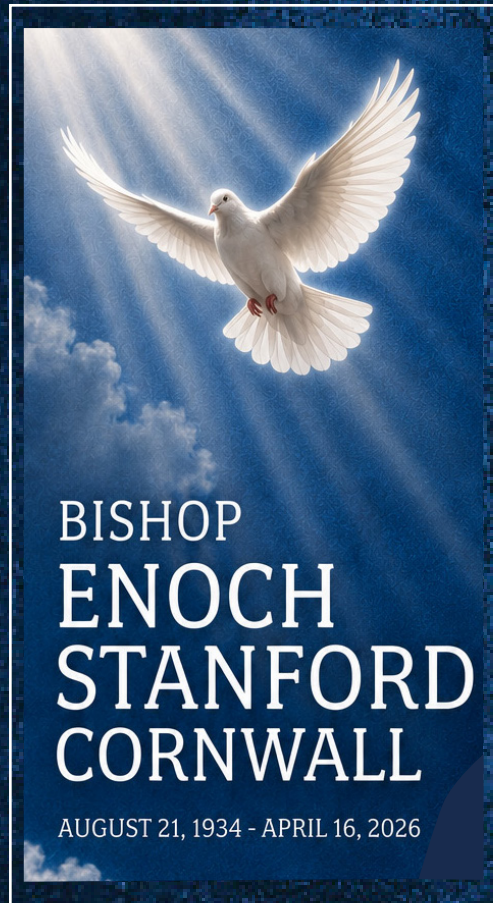
